Future Priorities

- Students and staff will nurture their relationship with Jesus by seeking ways to serve others. - ✓ Building on the acquisition and deeper understanding of French vocabulary, language and comprehension to better assist students with learning at a higher level. Continued efforts will be made to engage students, build accountability in their own learning and improve their understanding of curriculum objectives using formative and summative assessments
